ACTIVITY EXECUTION: A CHAIRMAN WHO EXECUTES A SPECIFIC DEPARTMENT WIDE ACTIVITY. HOWEVER, REPORTING FALLS UNDER ANOTHER PROGRAM WHERE THE "VALUE" OF THE ACTIVITY RESIDES.

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1. SITUATION.

- Continued decline in posts and membership will degrade the ability of the Department of Ohio in the next 5-7 years to sustain and maintain 12 Districts, influence the national and local debate, provide a robust Veterans Service Operation and maintain effective levels of forums and programs that support the VFW Mission. In addition, a steady decline will also impact the revenue VFW of Ohio Charities (VFWOC) and its Field Agents (Posts) have to provide direct support to veterans and community needs.
- Significant effort has been made to develop a "realistic" financial plan/budget accounting for current and projected revenue and expenses. By-Laws and Policy do <u>not</u> adequately reflect the current environment especially in the area of resources.
- Morale and communication within and outside the Department has improved! Instead of dwelling on the past, we are learning from it and <u>focusing on the future!!</u> This includes migration to less reliance on paper processes and increased use of Internet/electronic processes.
- At all leadership levels across the Department we are seeing a noticeable shift in younger veterans assuming leadership positions. Post Line Officers continue to work as a "team" focusing on looking at the "big picture" vs. one year only thinking.
- Integration with our Auxiliary partner continues to improve!
- Post attendance at District Meetings continues to be a growing problem!! There is a growing trend of Districts not having quorums during regular meetings.
- Program reporting continues to be complex and confusing. Root causes are too many mechanisms for reporting (paper, E-mail, on-line, etc.) lack of requirements/communication with web developers, and timely training.
- The Department's VA Voluntary Services (VAVS) from an overall Program perspective needs clearer expectation of duties, and better Department level support and advocacy. Appointed VAVS volunteers continue within the current structure to work hard to support their respective VA Locations!

2. MISSION.

- The mission of our National organization is: "To foster camaraderie among United States veterans of overseas conflicts. To serve our veterans, the military, and our communities. To advocate on behalf of all veterans."
- The mission of the Department of Ohio is: To foster greater collaboration of District/Posts to better focus service to our veterans, military and communities within the Department and to advocate on behalf of all veterans in concert with National Headquarters.

3. CONCEPT OF OPERATION.

a. Commander's intent.


- Continue to improve overall Department Morale! Change counterproductive efforts/attitudes. At all levels in the Department we must: **GIVE WAY TOGETHER** and **BRING BACK THE FUN!**
- Continue to develop and implement streamlined and efficient processes for the transmission and accounting for program reporting, Election Reports and "good standing" documentation.
- Complete the transition to an integrated, balanced and realistic Department financial plan to include investment strategy, operations and support budget and supporting By-Laws and Policy
- Develop and implement a Department "forward planning" process that will look past any one year and provide a plan for the next five years to include resources, policy, By-laws and viability of Districts/Posts.
- Address posts that do not attend District Meetings. Per Section 218 (a) (1) k., page 72 of the National Manual of Procedure, 2018 Edition; Ensuring attendance at District meetings is a Post Commander responsibility!
- Conduct a "strategic review" of our Veteran Service Operation: Business Model, Resources, etc.
- Formalize integrated planning and execution with the Auxiliary and VFWOC
- Improve training for District/Post Commanders and Quartermasters
- Improve mentoring and preparedness for Dept. Line Officers as they "move through the chairs"

- Improve coordination/communication with Department line officers and District Commanders
- Push recruiting and retention to the District and Post level They're the "boots on the ground!"
- Look "out of the box" for revenue and donations to support Department operations
- Make the VFW "visible" as a viable and progressive organization to internal and external publics
- Improve VAVS Operations

b. General Operations.

The Department operates on a Battle Rhythm which incorporates formal meetings (State and National), execution of Programs (State and National) and direct engagement with specific Districts/Posts via inspections and attendance at meetings, etc. Formal Meetings consist of Councils of Administration, Conferences, Conventions, and other meetings specified by the Commander. During these meetings important business is discussed and motions acted upon. For Department level meetings attendance by District leadership is required and to the maximum extent possible Posts should also attend. For District meetings attendance by Posts is required.

c. Programs: PROGRAM REPORTING IS A <u>MISSION RESPONSIBILITY</u>! NOT JUST FOR ALL STATE COMPETITION!!



ALL-STATE PROGRAM "POST"

State Commander, Dan Faulkner, along with his leadership team worked together to develop and implement a balanced All-State Program that supports the mission of the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States and facilitates <u>on-line</u> reporting via the Department of Ohio web-page (<u>www.vfwoh.org</u>). The ALL-STATE program will consist of three main categories: **GOOD STANDING, MEMBERSHIP AND PROGRAMS.**

GOOD STANDING

- Department Offices of Primary Responsibility for approval and reporting are the Dept. <u>Inspector (DI) and Adjutant (ADJ)</u>: Dates tracked by: Post Mark Date, E-mail transmit date, or fax transmit date. Unless otherwise stated by a specific Activity date, all below Activities must be accomplished No-Later-Than 30 April 2020.
 - a. <u>AUDITS (DI)</u>: Quarterly audits submitted to IG within thirty (30) calendar days from the end of each quarter. Receipt cutoff dates: **31 Jul 2019, 30 Sep 2019, 31 Dec 2019, and 30 Mar 2020**
 - **b. INSURANCE (ADJ):** Proper documentation submitted to ADJ to ensure policies are up to date, to include Liquor Liability insurance if applicable.
 - c. <u>DISTRICT MEETINGS (ADJ)</u>: Attend District <u>Council of Administration</u> and <u>all regular</u> District meetings, minimum of **one Post Representative**, during the year, unless formally excused by District Commander. Post Officers are encouraged to attend!
 - d. <u>INCORPORATION (ADJ):</u> Proper documentation submitted to ADJ to ensure current incorporation in the State of Ohio.
 - e. MONIES OWED THE DEPARTMENT (ADJ): Paid in full.
 - f. **BONDED (ADJ):** Appropriate Post officers/members bonded for the proper amount.

MEMBERSHIP

 Department Office of Primary Responsibility is the <u>Dept. Membership Director</u>: Final data will be taken from National VFW MEMSTATS at the close of the day <u>Thursday</u>, <u>April 30</u>, <u>2020</u>. NOTE: <u>All-American Post Membership cutoff is June 30</u>, <u>2020</u>.

100% Membership plus two (2) new Members on April 30, 2020

PROGRAMS GENERAL

- Department Office of Primary Responsibility for working with the District Program Coordinator (assists Posts with submitting reports on-line) and Department Program Chairmen is the <u>Dept. Program Director</u>. The Director is responsible for monitoring Program reporting status and resolving any on-line reporting issues. All <u>Core</u> and <u>Secondary</u> Program activities must be accomplished No-Later-Than <u>30 April 2020</u>.
- 2. On-line reporting via the Department web-page, **www.vfwoh.org**, will consist of one main template with options for Program selection, major reporting activity per program, examples of other activities per program, and accounting fields for number of people attending, hours, travel, activity description, etc. Once a number is entered the Program reporting tool will "do the math!" Calculation factors for 2019-20 are: Attendee Hourly rate is \$24.69, Mileage rate is \$0.14 per mile, Pint of blood is \$130, Wheel Chair daily loan rate is \$50, Walker daily loan rate is \$25. NOTE: These calculation factors were coordinate with VFW National HQ.
- 3. The "Activity" is "the unit of measure" for All-State requirements (1 Activity = 1 Report). Reports will be credited No-Later-Than the last day of the reporting period. Reporting Periods are:

Period #1: 1 May to 31 Aug. NOTE: This period covers transition to include online reporting, Department leadership, Program Chairmen, and allows time for Districts to hold their CofA to brief new Program Requirements! Commanders at all levels should use this time wisely!

Period #2: 1 Sept to 31 Dec. On-line reporting only!

Period #3: 1 Jan to 30 April. On-line reporting only!

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Membership Mission

To recruit, retain and mentor a stable membership base including all generations of veterans.

To cultivate a membership that is well versed in institutional knowledge and actively involved at all levels of the organization and in the local community. To establish Posts with a strong tradition of service, leadership and community outreach.

Introduction

For the past several years, the VFW has been relatively successful in recruiting members aged 39 and younger. The only way to make this success permanent is to retain those members, recover past members and recruit new members. We must improve the way we communicate with our members at all levels of the organization. Does your Post, District, State or Department have a newsletter, email, social media presence or an outreach team that visits fellow members? In many cases, we have lost touch with our members. We need to know who they are and what their needs are. Let us get back to the basics. Our first priority is taking care of our members and the veteran community as a whole.

Membership Goals

- **1.** Build a strong organization for the future.
- 2. Work together to achieve the VFW's goals. The VFW National Headquarters staff is available to assist in coordinating programs, developing new membership initiatives and building awareness among our membership and the entire veteran community.

Membership Objectives

- Recruit new and recover unpaid members
- Retain and mentor existing membership
- Develop new Posts and revitalize existing Posts
- Increase Life Membership
- Increase Legacy Life Membership

Retention Defined

Although retention is <u>not</u> a prerequisite for the All-American program, it is extremely important to understand how retention is derived and the important role retention plays in accomplishing growth. The number of paid annual members in your Post on July 1 is the ensuing year's "prior year total." One more new or reinstated member is required to make up for each prior year annual member the Post fails to retain.

Your Post retention is derived from six types of payment components based on your prior year total of annual members:

- A prior year annual member pays his or her annual membership dues.
- A prior year annual member pays the life membership installment fee.
- A prior year annual member pays for life membership dues.
- A prior year annual member transfers to another Post and pays his or herannual membership dues to your Post prior to transfer.
- A prior year annual member transfers to another Post and pays the life membership installment fee to your Post prior to transfer.
- A prior year annual member transfers to another Post and pays life membership dues to your Post prior to transfer.



Subject: Guidance for Paying Membership Dues with Post Charity dollars

To: VFW Department of Ohio

Comrades,

- 1. As I have moved through the various leadership positions in this Department, I have been exposed at all levels to the single most contentious phrase in our Department and that is "Buying Membership." This term has pitted Comrade against Comrade and does nothing to prepare our Department for the future. When I became State Jr. Vice-Commander, I along with my 2019-2020 leadership team, took deliberate action to hit this issue "head on" and develop guidance for our term of office.
- 2. Why is membership important understanding the "Big Picture:"
 - a) Membership is the <u>future</u> of our organization. Without new members, or retaining current members, our organization will slowly devolve into "non relevance." If this occurs, the VFW will no longer be a key advocate for Veterans rights, health care, employment, etc.!
 - b) To execute our VFW Mission, our Department sponsors activities, forums and programs to support veterans. To do this we need revenue. Membership is part of the solution that provides the revenue we need. We receive revenue from per capita tax and grants from National to include pay out for life members. A significant portion of our revenue is earmarked for Membership Programs, Veterans Service Operations, etc. Districts also receive support from the Department based on membership. As membership increases we have more revenue and as membership decrease we have less.
 - c) Membership allows us to shape the debate and influence the VFW at the National level. Membership determines delegates for voting on National Resolutions, membership in the "Big Ten" Conference, etc.
 - d) For Ohio, there is a historical responsibility to increase and maintain membership as this is where it all began for our great organization.

3. THE FOLLOWING GUIDANCE IS MY <u>STATED POSITION</u> FOR USING POST CHARITY DOLLARS FOR "PAYING MEMBERSHIP DUES:"

a) Paying membership dues for Active Duty and Active Guard and Reserve forces, Student Veterans, and First Responders. Supporting those that continue to wear the uniform, or those that have worn the uniform and are improving their civilian life by bettering their education and skills, or those that put themselves in "harm's way" on the home front directly supports our VFW mission.

- b) Paying the membership dues for any new member, or a Member-at-Large to bring them into a Post for a specified time, i.e. one or two years, etc., as a tool for recruiting. However, the first year is critical for reaching out to a new member. Making them feel part of a Post is essential for keeping them in the long run. Listen to their views, don't be afraid to change and give them a job in the Post—make them part of your team!
- c) Paying membership dues for those that <u>Posts</u> determine need assistance. Bottom-line: Posts know their membership and community best!!

To support the membership, "Big Picture," we are going to work hard this year to be 100% in the Department of Ohio and we will do so In Accordance With the above Guidance!


